



DIRECTOR'S NOTES

DOUG KING



Let's face it, these are not easy times right now. With common phrases like "new normal" and "separate yet together", people are experiencing loss of jobs, cut backs in wages, or being furloughed. This was not uncommon at all during the Great Depression 90 years ago. Now, as in the thirties, people are clinging to hope, a good news story of the day or a laugh from a comedian or comic strip.

The comic strip character, Little Orphan Annie, was created in 1924 by Harold Gray and made its debut in the New York Daily News. This comic strip featured a little red-headed orphaned girl who was taken in by billionaire Oliver Warbucks and went on great adventures with Warbucks' right-hand man Punjab (introduced in 1935). Mr. Gray was one of the few Americans who found prosperity throughout the depression because people loved the comic strip so much! They could forget about their troubles for a while, have a laugh, go on a wild adventure and find hope if only for a moment. Because of this great yearning for hope, Gray's character expanded to a radio show in 1930, an RKO film in 1935, and a Paramount film in 1938. The musical *Annie* opened in 1977.

The hope that Annie brought to the people of the depression in the 30's continues today for us through COVID-19! I feel so blessed to be working with the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre and making art, but so many are not able to work! Please do your best to stop this virus, support those who need it if you can, especially in the arts and help keep art alive!

May the hope that Annie brings encourage you, and may your "tomorrow" be blessed!



Acting for the stage is an all-encompassing process that involves a great deal of collaboration from many different people. The art, process and effects of live performance are incredibly important in the current world of social media, digital technology and screens. Being fully present with a group of tangible, living, breathing people is important to the art of acting and for the human spirit.

1) Theatre helps us to see a different perspective from our own. We're shown humanity, psychology, motivation, conflict and resolution. Theatre encourages us to give power to truth, to take risks, and to advocate for new and diverse voices.

2) Theatre reminds us that we are not alone. Not only are we sharing space and an experience with the artists who are performing, we are sharing the experience with fellow audience members. Movies and television don't have the same intimacy or sense of participation. Sharing an experience with live actors and live audience members is not only valuable, it's necessary for human connection.

3) Theatre is immediate, evolving and always different. Although the script may be the same every night, the performance is unique each and every time it happens. No two performances are ever the same. In this way, everyone involved has a distinct and unique experience that can never be replicated.


