

Welcome to the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre's 97th Anniversary Season, Our "On the Road" Season!

We are thrilled to have AJ Lorenzini make his Civic Theatre Directorial debut with *The Rocky Horror Show*. Thank you to AJ, to the Civic Theatre staff and volunteers who dedicated many

hours of creativity and hard work to this show!

Arts United has begun renovating the Arts United Center, our home for the past 50 years. At the end of May the Civic Theatre relocated to 1940 Bluffton Road in the Foster Park Plaza just west of the Clyde. This location is now where we hold all auditions and rehearsals, house our offices, scene shop, costume shop, and more. If all goes as planned, we will return to the Arts United Center for our holiday show in November 2025, then return all operations back to the Arts United Center come December 2025.

During this renovation period the Civic Theatre will incur over \$768,000 in unexpected costs that is NOT a part of Arts United's campaign. For this reason, we had to establish our *Inspire Campaign* which is totally separate from Arts United's *Soaring Vision Campaign*. We thank Arts United for their approval of our campaign and for the work they are pursuing with the renovation. DIRECTOR'S NOTES

AJ LORENZINI



The Rocky Horror Show premiered on the West End in 1973, almost 51 years ago to the exact day that I'm writing these notes. I have to admit that number really shocked me when I did the math. The original London and Los Angeles productions were successful, but the musical did not find success on Broadway. Even the

now iconic film version was not an immediate success, only through years of midnight showings and audience participation has it become one of the most well-known musicals in the musical theatre canon. Its popularity makes it a natural choice for the Civic Theatre, as audiences from all around will be familiar with its iconic moments. But I didn't want it to be that simple...

The Rocky Horror Show was very subversive for its time, and still is in many ways over fifty years later. When presented with the immense opportunity to direct this show, one question immediately came to my mind: "How can we bring this show that has been entertaining and shocking audiences for half a century to 2024?"

At its core, *The Rocky Horror Show* is a story about a traditional young couple that gets thrown into a world they don't understand and are inherently uncomfortable with. I immediately wanted to take Brad and Janet, the nuclear ideal of a 1950s American couple, and put them in the most uncomfortable situation they could be: a 1980s underground punk gay club. This is the environment that the creators of *The Rocky Horror Show* were very familiar with, so why not place the story there? Exciting ideas immediately came to mind: "Frank-N-Furter is the drag headliner of the club!", "Riff is the bouncer!" "The Phantoms are the patrons!" It all began to click. Fortunately, the entire Civic Theatre staff immediately gravitated to these ideas and ran full speed ahead with this vision.

Two of the biggest people I need to thank are my Assistant Director, Brandon Porter, and my "creative consultant" Michael Bartkiewicz, who both listened to my wild ideas and kept me in check at all times in preparation for this show. It also helps that we have an absolute dream of a creative team (Olivia, Rollie, Bobbi Jo, Brittney) along for the ride. Thank you to Phillip for this amazing opportunity, and of course to "THIS. CAST." for bringing this story to life with charisma, uniqueness, nerve, and talent! I constantly think of myself as one of the luckiest guys around, and that is no joke!

No more antici.....pation! On with the show!

RICHARD O'BRIEN (Book, Music, Lyrics) who was born in 1942, began his life in the world of entertainment in 1965, when, at the age of he rode horses in British-made movies. He had no desire to become a full-time stuntman and, wisely, took himself off to an evening drama school which claimed to adhere to the teaching principles of Stanislavski, Lee Strasberg, Stella Adler, and anyone else that had decided to embrace the more 'naturalistic' approach to acting, commonly known as The Method. In 1967, Richard became an ASM and understudy in a musical touring version of The Barretts of Wimpole Street, retitled Robert and Elizabeth. He worked backstage in many West End theatres, most notably the Cambridge Theatre at Seven Dials. In 1969, Richard joined an ensemble group in a joyous production of Gulliver's Travels at the Mermaid Theatre. This show was designed and directed by Sean Kenny. The choreographer was a young Japanese Canadian called David Toguri and the following year, Richard auditioned for him once again and joined the cast of the British touring production of the American 'hippie' musical Hair. After Hair came Jesus Christ Superstar, which was directed by Jim Sharman. The following year, 1973, Jim cast Richard in a Sam Shepard play at the Royal Court Theatre's Theatre Upstairs. It was here that he met Richard Hartley, his music partner of more than 40 years. The Rocky Horror Show opened in July of the same year and, slowly but surely, became the biggest cult musical of all time. In a career that has spanned 50 years. Richard has acted with some of the biggest and best-known names in the industry and, lately, he has won over a new and younger crowd of fans as the voice of Lawrence Fletcher, the father of Phineas and Ferb, in the Disney cartoon series of the same name. AJ LORENZINI (Director) is making his community directing debut with The Rocky Horror Show! He is no stranger to Fort Wayne theatre, having appeared as an actor and technician with Civic Theatre, Arena Dinner Theatre, First Pres, TRMT, SCMT, and IMTF. He received Anthony Awards for his roles as The Cat in the Hat in Seussical, the ensemble of Sweeney Todd, and the one-man-play Buyer & Cellar, as well as Arena Awards for his performances as Aldolpho in The Drowsy Chaperone and the Headwaiter in She Loves Me. Other favorite roles at the Civic Theatre include Cinderella's Stepmother in Into The Woods, Frederick in Young Frankenstein, Harry in Mamma Mia!, and Mandy Patinkin in Forbidden Broadway. AJ is currently in his 9th year as a high school theatre director, where he has directed over 15 productions including Beauty and the Beast, Little Shop of Horrors, Clue, and The Wizard of Oz. He thanks the entire Civic Theatre board and staff for this amazing opportunity, his amazing cast and dream production team, and Quyen for being the best supporter in the whole world!



KATE BLACK (Narrator) has done extensive work on stage in both Fort Wayne and San Francisco, where she worked professionally for ten years. She has been seen most recently as Prospero in the PFW Theatre's *The Tempest*, as Violet in TRMT's *August: Osage County*, as Celeste in

Into the Breeches at Arena Dinner Theater, and as Edith Hamilton in Playground 630's Women Unbound. Other favorites include Eleanor of Aquitaine, Mother Teresa, and Claudius. Kate is excited to join this great Civic company in a role her dearest played in 2016!

BROCK IRELAND (Dr. Frank-N-Furter) is ecstatic to be returning to the Fort Wayne Civic stage! Past credits include: Albin/Zsa Zsa in *La Cage Aux Folles*, Benjamin in *Joseph!*, and a slew of featured roles that don't fit in the word count. He would like to thank his community for their

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

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
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


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
